STEAMSHIP PASSAGE: First Class minimum rates.

TRAVEL IN GREAT BRITAIN AND EUROPE: First Class on trains in Great Britain and on the Continent; first class accommodations on cross-Channel steamers and first class Sleeping Car berths. For motor coach travel, seats in private vehicles are provided.

HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS: Rooms with bath (where available and obtainable) at Superior First Class hotels.

MEALS: Three "table d'hote" meals daily. In European hotels and restaurants the "table d'hote" meals usually include the best dishes prepared for the day. Tour members who prefer to order "a la carte" must pay any supplementary charges direct to the hotel. On the Continent, breakfast will be a substantial meal (not the usual Continental breakfast of coffee, rolls and butter.) In Great Britain, breakfast usually consists of fruit or cereal as well as toast or rolls, coffee or tea. In London and Paris, breakfast and dinner only are included, except on full-day sightseeing drives, when luncheon is included. When traveling by train, motor coach or local steamers, meals are also included. After-Dinner teas or coffees are included.

SIGHTSEEING: Private motor coach provided for sightseeing as specified in the itinerary.

TRANSFERS of passengers and two pieces of hand baggage between railroad stations, hotels and piers in Great Britain and Europe.

BAGGAGE SUGGESTIONS: Under present conditions it is not advisable for those who are to travel through several countries to take trunks abroad. Travelers taking the tour are advised to carry as small an amount of baggage as possible. Two standard size suitcases $(9\frac{1}{2}^{"}x15"x 26")$ will be carried free of cost on trains and motor coaches.

A TOUR MANAGER OR ESCORT will accompany the group from its arrival in Great Britain and Europe to the place of departure where passengers board the boat-train to the port of departure.

TIPS: Fees and tips to hotel servants, to the extent of services included in the tour fare, also admission fees to museums and monuments on sightseeing trips.

TAXES on travel and hotel accommodations within Great Britain and Europe as at present imposed by British and European governments. Passports, visas, tips to stewards on cross-Channel steamers, which are better left to the passengers' own discretion; steamer chairs or rugs; laundry; wines, liquors, mineral waters, or food not on the menus of the included meals; additional baggage; baggage or other insurance; and items not listed above as being included in the tour fares. All rates on steamer are based at minimum rate and should preferred staterooms be desired supplementary rates will be charged.
